Deb gave the history of her relatively short, but exceptional, career as a quilter and talked about what she considers to be, "very quick and easy paper piecing". Her stunning work is all done in batiks and doesn't look quick and easy to this writer. Some of her tips were to use a 1.5 stitch length, use embroidery, sharps or metallic needles, change them AND your rotary cutter blade every 4 hours of use – not like most of us do just when they break!

Deb's shoes were another great story about how they saved her from being crippled. They were pretty unusual but have made a huge difference in her life.

## A note from our quilt challenge coordinators, Loraine Shaw and Suzanne Michaud.....

Several people have asked about the fat quarter quilt challenge rules so they have been reprinted below. If you're still interested in entering, there are fat quarter packets available at Forever Quilting. Here are the rules:

### SARNIA QUILTERS GUILD CHALLENGE September 2009

#### **THEME: Bloomin' Business**

**GUIDELINES:** Using the challenge fabric, make a wall hanging, any size between 50" and 100" total outside measurement. Perimeter no more than 100" – any shape, any techniques.

Add as many other fabrics as you wish but still use an appreciable amount of the main fabric on the front.

It must be ready to hang with a 2" sleeve.

**DEADLINE: July 15, 2009** (note new date)

**RETURN:** To Loraine Shaw:332-5193 or Suaznne Michaud: 542-4464 or to Forever Quilting

Your entry should have a covered label and be enclosed in a closed pillowcase, cloth bag, or paper bag so no one can see it (either taped shut or tied).

Judging will be on overall appearance, workmanship and use of challenge fabric.

Prizes will be awarded.
